Regulating Above Ground Facilities

This week, I voted in favor of improving regulations on Above Ground Facilities (AGFs) in City Council. AGFs are pieces of equipment installed on utility poles and other parts of the public right-of-way that are necessary for telecommunications services. The change to the existing ordinance will require companies to provide better notification for nearby residents of new AGFs. Many community members have voiced concerns about inadequate notification and a negative impact of some AGFs on the aesthetics of their neighborhoods.

Chatsworth Nature Preserve Ecology Pond to Remained Filled Always...



The Chatsworth Nature Preserve Ecology Pond will remain filled with water.

I received a letter from Department of Water and Power (DWP) General Manager Ron Nichols saying that DWP would always keep the Ecology Pond in Chatsworth Nature Preserve filled with water. In August, DWP filled the Ecology Pond in response to my requests.

The water level of the Ecology Pond had been sinking lower and lower due to natural evaporation. Many nearby residents and members of the environmental and wildlife protection

community shared my concerns that this could have destroyed what was a beautiful and delicate ecosystem supporting numerous plant and animal species.

The Chatsworth Nature Preserve and its ecology pond are treasures of open space and natural habitat. They are very special to me and to the surrounding community and I am committed to protecting them. In addition, the Ecology Pond offers a location for the Fire Department's water-dropping helicopters to fill their water buckets so they respond more quickly to wildfires in the nearby hills.

I am grateful to Mr. Nichols for recognizing the importance of protecting the Ecology Pond and responding quickly to my request.

CSUN's new Transit Center, on campus at Darby Ave. and Vincennes St., opened for service in June. The station will offer CSUN students who use public

transportation a convenient on-campus drop-off and pick-up location on weekdays.

Bus lines stopping at the Transit Center include:

Metro Rapid Line 741 from CSUN to Ventura Blvd. and Metro Line 167 from Studio City to CSUN and on to Chatsworth; AVTA Line 676 to and from the Antelope Valley; the CSUN Metrolink Shuttle.

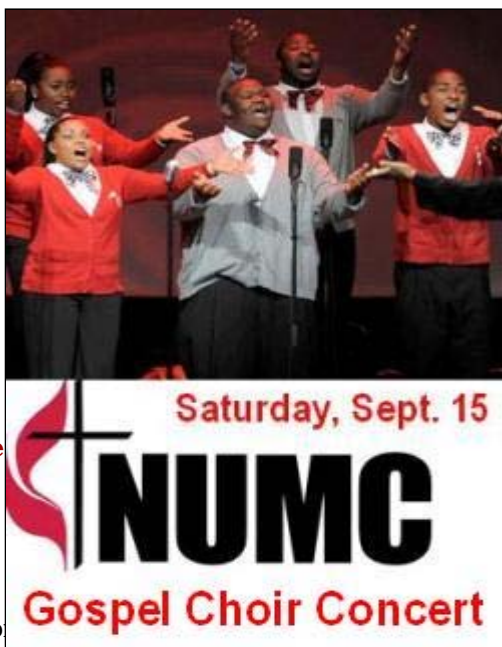

The LAPD's Community-Police Advisory Boards (C-PABs) were created in 1993 to provide community members with an opportunity to share information with the local Police Officers that protect and serve their neighborhoods. It also offers the LAPD to share important public safety, crime prevention and crime trend information with the community.

Each of the 21 geographic Areas (community police stations) throughout Los Angeles has its own C-PAB which meets monthly. Each C-PAB has two co-chairs - one is one of the Area Commanding Officers while the second is a civilian member voted on by the Advisory Board. Many C-PABS also have subcommittees focusing on specific issues such as graffiti, youth, homeless outreach and traffic.

A Year of Emergency Preparedness...

On January 17, the 18th anniversary of the 1994 Northridge Earthquake, we kicked off our Year of Emergency Preparedness in Los Angeles.

Throughout 2012, we will be working on legislation, programs and public awareness efforts to help the residents of Los Angeles and the San Fernando Valley be prepared for natural or man-made disasters.



Every week, our newsletter will feature a new item in an **Emergency Preparedness Checklist**. These are simple steps that everyone in Los Angeles should take in order to be prepared for any disaster. If you follow each item on this checklist, you will be highly prepared at the end of the year.

Week 33: Instant Cold Compresses / Chemical Cold Packs / Instant Ice Packs...

First Aid for some injuries is applying a cold compress. But if you are without power for an extended period, you won't have access to ice (unless you own a generator that can power your refrigerator). An easy, low-cost solution is instant cold compresses. The cold packs do not need to be refrigerated, and are activated by bending the package, which mixes two chemicals together producing a cold compress that lasts for hours.
