## **Banning Convicted Felons and Sex Offenders from Holding Public Office...**

My motion to ban convicted felons and sex offenders from holding any public office in the City of Los Angeles was unanimously approved by the City Council on Wednesday, Oct. 17.

Currently, the City Charter prohibits any person from serving in elected or appointed office in Los Angeles for five years after having been convicted of a felony.

My motion would further tighten those restrictions. It would require all elected officials, appointed Commissioners, Neighborhood Council Members, and General Managers of City Departments to declare under penalty of perjury that they have never been convicted of a violent felony or sexual offense. It would also require a sitting appointed or elected official found to have such a conviction in their past, to immediately step down.

### Launch of OK/HELP Free Post Earthquake Window Sign...

As Chair of the Public Safety Committee I was proud to join LAFD Fire Chief Brian Cummings, Terri Corigliano, Chief Communications Officer of American Red Cross, Los Angeles Region, and Dr. Lucy Jones of the US Geological Survey to launch the new OK/HELP earthquake window sign. We were joined by dozens of CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) volunteers.



On Monday, Oct. 15 we held a press conference and live demonstration of how this valuable community preparedness tool will be used.

OK/HELP is a window sign with clear, simple instructions provided by the Los Angeles Fire Department, American Red Cross, and the U.S. Geological Survey on what to do immediately after a major earthquake. After a major earthquake, the user tears off the sign and posts it in their front window indicating to emergency personnel, Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT) or neighbors if they are "OK" or need "HELP."

After the press conference, a live demonstration was staged showing how to use the OK/HELP sign. Several houses posted the sign up in their windows. The CERT volunteer team swept the street, checking the status of all of the houses. When they located the house that needed "HELP," they radioed the location to the Firefighters, who responded with a Fire Engine and simulated giving aid to the injured resident.

50,000 OK/HELP window signs will be distributed for free to LA residents, first in the San Fernando Valley and eventually city wide. As part of a broader outreach effort to increase community engagement in emergency preparedness, they will available at LAFD Fire Stations, Recreation Centers, libraries, and will be handed out at Neighborhood Council meetings, Neighborhood Watch meetings, and will be

## Open House on Chatsworth Park South Clean-Up...

We hosted an informational open house on Oct. 18 with the State Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC) and the City Department of Recreation and Parks to update the community and answer questions on the progress of the clean-up at Chatsworth Park South, as well as future activity at the park, and the next steps toward re-opening it to the public.

The park was closed in February 2008 for safety reasons after lead and other contaminants were discovered. The contamination resulted from clay pigeons used for skeet shooting on the land, which was a shooting range more than 50 years ago before it became a City park.

We are committed to ensuring that the park is safe for use by the community and getting it open so that families can once again enjoy it. We continue to work closely with DTSC and Recreation and Parks to get the park cleaned up and safe for use.

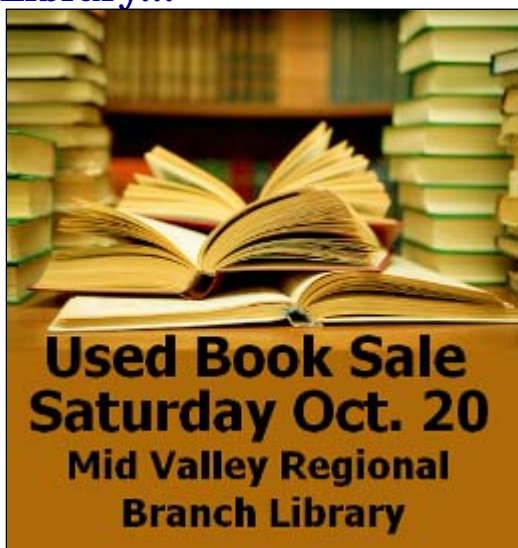

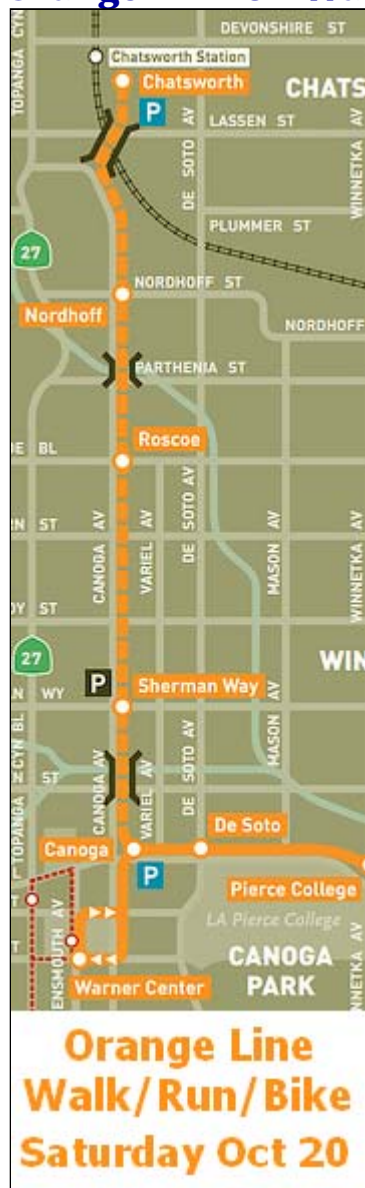

## A Year of Emergency Preparedness...

On January 17, the 18th anniversary of the 1994 Northridge Earthquake, we kicked off our Year of Emergency Preparedness in Los Angeles.

Throughout 2012, we will be working on legislation, programs and public awareness efforts to help the residents of Los Angeles and the San Fernando Valley be prepared for natural or man-made disasters.



Every week, our newsletter will feature a new item in an **Emergency Preparedness Checklist**. These are simple steps that everyone in Los Angeles should take in order to be prepared for any disaster. If you follow each

item on this checklist, you will be highly prepared at the end of the year.

### **Week 38: Sunscreen, Walking Shoes & Maps...**

It's a good idea to keep sunscreen, walking shoes and city maps in the earthquake kit in your car. If you are in your car when a major earthquake strikes, the roads may become impassible, and you could have to walk a long distance to get home or to a shelter. Paper maps may be old-fashioned in today's era of smartphones with GPS maps, but if internet or phone service is down, a paper map could help you get home.

Having to walk for several hours in high-heeled shoes or men's dress shoes could make the journey painful and slow, so it's a good idea to keep walking shoes in your car. Without sunscreen, you could end up with a bad sunburn. Under disaster conditions, even small physical injuries like this can become a serious problem.

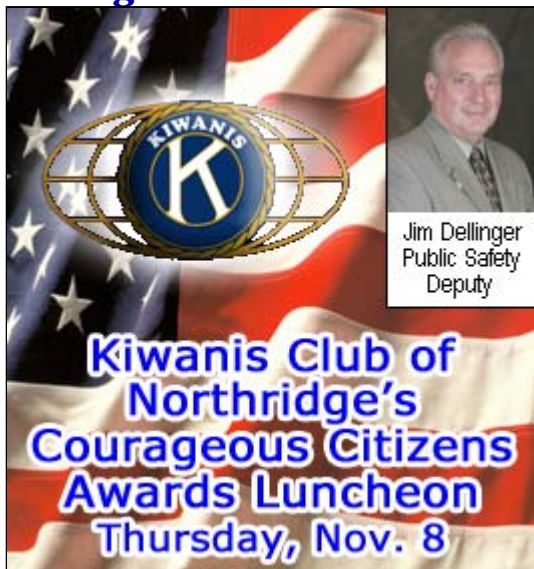
